# The Voice of Faith

Dear friends of Faith,

I have friends, Jacques and Kristy, who never make new years' resolutions. Resolutions are too easy to break, they figure, and rarely lead to lasting change. Their solution? Pick a **theme** for the year, like finances, or health. They do things in keeping with the theme, creating a budget or opening a new savings account; seeking to exercise more and getting annual checkups. Having a central topic or area of focus to guide and inform how their energy and time will be spent leaves more room for innovation and less possibility for failure. After hearing Deb Colmers discuss *Why New Years' Resolutions are so hard to keep* (at Adult Forum this past Sunday), I realize that a **Theme of the Year** might have drawbacks. Choosing a theme without setting specific, time-bound goals won't likely lead to much transformation. But, when coupled with goals, I've found themes can give rise to a new mind-set, and positive change.

All that to say, I'm embracing a theme for my ministry with Faith this year: **Connection**. How do we continue to connect as a congregation as the pandemic pushes on? Are there creative ways we might gather and engage with one another? New friendships we might foster or existing relationships that we could deepen? Do you have ideas for how we can better connect with busy students or isolated homebound folks? I'm still working to meet and get to know you all, and I am hopeful there will be more opportunities for us to gather safely as a Faith family as vaccines become more available in the months to come, and/or as the weather warms – whichever eventually comes first. How might we connect with our neighbors, and with the students and families at Walter P. Carter Elementary/Middle School in new ways? Is there insight to be gained about how we've connected with new and far-flung members of the Faith diaspora online, and more we could or should be doing to engage virtually?

One of the strengths I've come to appreciate about Faith is how engaged and supportive you are with and for one another. God is present in our relationships – when we trust each other, collaborate, and offer both support and accountability. As we





The pageant was a challenge this year, just like everything else. It took not only the kids, but their parents and grandparents and siblings, their teachers, and their pastor Cat,

## WORSHIP & THE ARTS

The Season of Advent and Christmas in the year of 2020 during the Covid Virus isolation will long be remembered. Following the guidelines outlined by the public health experts we were already practicing social distancing, wearing masks and worshipping virtually. Planning worship presented a great challenge!



Early on our Pastor, Cat, reminded us that a ritual of prayer and reflection would help us keep centered in the midst of tumult. And,

that Advent is a time to hold on to a spark of hope, watching and waiting for the mystery of divine action to unfold. The first steps offered a Mason Jar Advent Calendar, A Maya Angelou Advent devotion, an Advent Candle making kit and an ornament template. Those who were able could pick up the supplies at their safest convenience and arrange were made to deliver to anyone unable to come to the church building.



The Advent Festival has a long history of being a combined time of fellowship and a way to support the work of the Deacons. Social distancing appeared to make it impossible. But creative minds created a virtual Festival that offered sweet treats, handmade crafts, themed baskets and more that resulted in a sizeable donation to the Hands of Faith.



Arrangements were made that provided Liturgists and Advent Candle Lighters safe ways to prerecord their parts that magically appeared on screen as if they were there in person. The Children's Pageant was practiced

and recorded by parents in the safety of their own homes and pieced together by Pastor Cat. Virtually, it was a flawless First Class Presentation!



Covid did not stop Christmas from coming. The Christmas Eve Zoom service offered beautiful music, Communion, and lighting candles while singing Silent Night as the Sanctuary when dark. Much has changed in our lives during this pandemic, but we found ways to preserve the rituals that have come to be part of the worship as a family of Faith. We celebrated Christ's coming together. ## MUSIC

Since we are not able to gather physically, Samuel has found wonderful soloists to lead the hymns and sing the anthem. The following is a bit about them.



**Ayanna Freelon** is a classically trained Soprano from Grenada, Mississippi. In spite of her humble beginnings, she has still managed to create a very promising career. While pursuing her undergraduate degree, she was afforded many opportunities to travel the world. One of her proudest accomplishments includes being selected as a young artist in the Lingua e' Canto summer program in St. Angelo in Vado, Italy. After graduating with honors from her undergraduate university, she went on to pursue her Masters of Arts in Music from Morgan State University. While attending Morgan, she was afforded the opportunity to sing as the soprano soloist in Bach's Magnificat, as well as Mary Leila Wright in the opera Lyrics of Sunshines and Shadows, composed by Steven Allen. Aside from singing in Italy, Ms. Freelon has sung in China and Spain. Miss Freelon also takes pride in curating recitals and concerts in the Baltimore/ DMV area. She shows immense promise, and with the help and support of family, she has been able to touch the lives of many people through song.



**Daniel Rich**, baritone, is an emerging artist that has performed with Frostburg Opera, Morgan Opera, MSM Opera Theater, Trilogy Opera, Phoenicia Festival of The Voice, Opera

Delaware, and Maryland Opera. Daniel has enjoyed early success not only as a young opera singer but as a recitalist & an emerging concert artist, performing Concert & Oratorio work with organizations such as Opera Ebony, DC Strings Workshop, Brooklyn Ecumenical, South East Queens Ecumenical, Three on 3, CAAPA, NANM, and Harlem Opera Theater, amongst others. Daniel is a winner of the Harlem Opera Theater Vocal Competition, The Mario Lanza Institute Vocal Competition, The B-Sharp Chapter of NANM's Marian Anderson Vocal Competition and the Opera Ebony Benjamin Matthews Vocal Competition. Mr. Rich made his Carnegie Hall debut as a soloist in Vaughan-Williams' Serenade to Music under the baton of Maestro Leonard Slatkin for the MSM Centennial Gala. Also, he was the recipient of the Edgar Foster Daniels Scholarship in Voice at MSM. Daniel gave several Spirituals and Art Song Recitals, a Masterclass at Delaware State University, and was in residency with Opera Delaware in their Young Artist Program. Most recently Mr. Rich has performed in recital for The Walters Art Museum as well as concerts for Opera Delaware and Maryland Opera. Daniel is an alumnus of Morgan State University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Music and studied, respectively, with Vincent Stringer and Marquita Lister. He is a graduate of the Manhattan School of Music, where he earned his Master of Music degree and studied in the voice studio of Mr. Mark Oswald. Daniel now studies in the private studio of Mr. Luis Ledesma (Curtis Institute/AVA).



**Dimery Alexis Mowery** hails from Bowie, Maryland. Ms. Mowery attended The New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, MA during her freshman year of college where

she studied classical vocal performance under the direction of Ms. Patricia Craig. Dimery transferred to Morgan State University to complete her education and study with Marquita Lister and sing under the tutelage of Dr. Eric Conway with the world renowned Morgan State University Choir. Upon joining the MSU vocal studies department, Ms. Mowery has studied and performed leading soprano roles, such as Bess (Porgy and Bess), Laretta (Gianni Schicchi) Liu (Turandot), La Contessa (Le Nozze di Figaro), and has participated in numerous masterclasses with notable performers and conductors nationally and internationally. Ms. Mowery has performed in Italy, Russia, Australia, Oman, UAE, Brazil, Argentina, Austria, Germany, Salzburg, and Cuba.

Honing such a glorious talent, Ms. Mowery continues to perform on renowned opera stages worldwide. Most recently, Ms. Mowery placed in Harlem Opera Theater's 2019 Vocal Competition and won the Audience Choice award. Ms. Mowery currently performs with the historic American Spiritual Ensemble, The Gateway Classical Music Society, and The Cathedral Choir at Abyssinian Baptist Church in Harlem. Ms. Mowery hopes to further the wealth of her musical knowledge and aspires to inspire others to work hard and fulfill their dreams as she manifests in hers.

At the December meeting of the Social and Environmental Justice Council we decided to use the funds raised by the Global Witness Offering to support the eviction prevention fund at the GEDCO CARES food pantry.

We furnished the art supplies for the holiday Zoom Family Engagement Night at Walter P Carter which consisted of an art project directed by **Ms. Keila Evans**, the art teacher. Our community engagement grant money also covered the cost of gift certificates for meals for the families who participated. We are consulting with the Walter P Carter staff to find out how we can assist them as they move into their new building, a process that has already begun. The ribbon-cutting at the new building is expected to take place the first week in January. We will update everyone as we get more news from the school.

As we head into the new year, we are preparing to monitor activity in the Maryland General Assembly on issues such as police reform and affordable housing and are planning a new Signs of Faith display around the theme of the Martin Luther King, Jr., holiday.

### Faith Care Day



Having been monitoring the leaf dropage on the church property, P & P members finally determined that Mother Nature and the oaks were ready to call it quits on fall foliage. Saturday, December 12 was declared a Care Day with the priority project being leaf mulching and/or removal. Mike Shirey ran the tractor mower, and Dawn Shirey served as the push mower operator for the smaller spaces; together, they ground up the leaves on the lawns to return their nutrients to the soil. Meanwhile, a second team of leaf rakers and blowers (Neil Nemser, Bill Curtis, Jack Nesbitt, and Paula and Peter Burger) cleared the large parking lot and its gutters of accumulated leaves. Veteran operator Dave Brown used one of the blowers to spiff up the lot. The leaves taken from the surface lots

were dumped in a very large leaf and vegetation compost pile near the cell tower fence.

This Care Day was done with dispatch and saved the church a hefty fee to a landscaping company that had proposed charging almost \$900 for this project. See what Faith can do!





### New Faces Worshiping with Faith




