October 30 – *Dialogue for Peaceful Change*. A new Forum series on conflict transformation concludes on October 30. **Rev. Kate Foster** and **Karen Burd** will lead our engagement and exploration of conflict and peace building using tools and a mediation methodology developed by the Dialogue for Peaceful Change.
