SHARING OF COMMUNION

In the sanctuary, you may either receive the juice by intinction (dip the bread in the cup), or with the sealed cup to take back to your pew. Gluten free bread is in a smaller dish on each plate. Come forward by the center aisle and return to your seat by the outside aisle.

If you are joining us from home, please break your bread when the bread is broken in the sanctuary. When the cup is poured, please pour it at home, or touch the cup if you've already filled it. We give thanks that the Spirit is present wherever we are, knitting us together as the body of Christ in the world.

PRAY IN COLOR

People greeted Jesus with joy, shouting "Hosanna!" which means "save us!" From what do we need to be saved today? When you come forward to receive communion, write your word/prayer on a piece of purple paper and cut it into a narrow strip to adorn our banners and return it as an offering.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

God of grace, as we look ahead to Holy Week, we long to be faithful disciples, serving as you have served us. We long to be steadfast companions, awake in the darkest hour. We long to follow in your footsteps, even if they lead us to the site of an execution.

May the meal we have shared strengthen us for the road ahead. May the bread we have broken and shared join us as Christ's body in the world. May the cup we have poured be for us his love and life, poured out for the world. We ask this in the name of our savior, Amen.
