**Tiffany Richardson** is the Business Process Manager with Fairfax Station Enterprises, who manages Lochwood Apartments. She has been deeply involved in our efforts to improve neighborhood safety and build a strong relationship with residents, our city councilor, and the police.

**Kate Foster** is the Mid-Atlantic Director of Trail Development with the Rails to Trails Conservancy who also serves as a parish associate at Faith, preaching, leading worship, teaching, and supporting our community engagement efforts.
