

If you are at home, when the bread is broken, please break your bread. When the cup is poured, please pour it or touch the cup if you've already filled it. We give thanks that the Spirit is present wherever we are, knitting us together as the body of Christ in the world.

Interactive Lenten Prayer Project: The prophet Isaiah points towards God's work in the wilderness, saying: I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

Is there a place in your life or in the world where you pray the Spirit is at work to make a way where there seems to be no way? Come forward, write a word to signify the situation or the name of the place where you pray a new thing might be ready to spring forth. Let it be an offering of your hope for the future, a sign of your trust in God's promise of renewal and redemption.
